Pro-Family Women commends U.S. Supreme Court on Texas Heartbeat Bill

Arlington, Virginia – Pro-Family Women commends the U.S. Supreme Court for allowing the Texas heartbeat bill to remain in effect while the challenge to the bill is litigated in court. Late last night, the Supreme Court rejected a last-ditch effort to block enforcement of the bill. The Texas law bans abortions after a doctor detects a fetal heartbeat (which is usually around six weeks) and allows for civil lawsuits against abortion providers who violate the law or against anyone who "aids or abets" the performance of the abortion.

Pro-Family Women's president, Susan Muskett, said: "By allowing the Texas heartbeat bill to remain in effect, untold number of unborn children's lives may be spared, and their mothers spared the heartache and mental torment of having aborted their own child."

Regrettably, President Biden responded to the Supreme Court's action by saying he would direct the Gender Policy Council and the Office of the White House Counsel to "launch a whole-of-government effort to respond to this decision, looking specifically to the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Justice to see what steps the Federal Government can take to ensure that women in Texas have access to safe and legal abortions as protected by Roe." This is the latest example of President Biden's commitment to abortion, despite his action being at odds with Catholic Church teaching.
